Northampton Forward

Northampton Forward is a partnership of key organisations with the primary role of co-ordinating and driving forward the regeneration and economic growth of Northampton. It is responsible for developing and driving forward the strategy and vision for the transformation of the town.

The board includes representatives from West Northamptonshire Council, South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership (SEMLEP), The University of Northampton, Northamptonshire Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, Northamptonshire Chamber of Commerce, Royal & Derngate, Northampton Town Centre Business Improvement Districts (BID), Members of Parliament, Private Sector and Community Representatives.

Northampton Forward's role is to:

- Establish and drive the vision for Northampton in partnership with key stakeholders and organisations
- Take forward the vision and masterplan for the town centre to attract inward investment
- Oversee the Towns Fund and Future High Street
 programme of projects within Northampton town centre

Market Square Transformation

The Market Square transformation will regenerate the heart of Northampton Town Centre. The previous space was underused, in poor condition and did not meet the needs of the community. Through Future High Street Funding we will create new permanent high-quality market stalls, new seating, increased number of trees, a bespoke interactive water feature and a flexible community and events space. The square will be resurfaced and will include new street furniture, lighting, CCTV and public art.


This project will positively revitalise one of the busiest commercial and pedestrian routes through the town's main shopping street. It will provide improved pedestrian access, new seating, planting, outdoor dining space and encourage community activity. It will complement the wider Market Square Transformation and provide enhanced connectivity throughout the town.

24 Guildhall Road

The previously derelict heritage asset will be redeveloped into an innovative and creative cultural space for artists and the community; upper floors intended to be let to cultural sector tenants. This project is a partnership between West Northamptonshire Council and NN Contemporary Art and will provide over 26 new artist studios, a contemporary art gallery and space, multimedia room, a reading room, library space and visitor's shop.



Four Waterside and Marefair Development

Situated at the entrance of the town from Northampton's Railway station, this is one of the largest brownfield development opportunities across West Northamptonshire.

This new development will unlock this space and provide grade A office space, a new hotel, and high-quality homes in the town centre.

35 – 45 Abington Street


Located at the heart of the town the rejuvenation of 35 – 45 Abington Street buildings (formerly M&S and BHS) will provide new homes for residents above modern lesiure or retail space on the ground floor.


Bringing this former vacant space to life, this is set to create new homes and employment opportunities.



The Old Black Lion

The Old Black Lion is a grade II listed former pub, celebrated as the oldest pub in Northampton. This project will positively revitalise this pub while also providing home to the Churches Conversation Trusts headquarters, who are relocating from London. The project will form part of the transformation of the gateway into the town centre and money raised through the pub will also allow for the neighbouring Grade I listed St Peter's Church to be maintained and used as a community facility.








Marefair Heritage Park

This new heritage park will provide much need amenity space in a major gateway into the town and will include new play area, community garden space, seating, pathways and planting. It will celebrate Northampton's unique heritage, including castle and mound, whilst enhancing the settings of Northampton's Grade I listed St Peter's Church and Grade II listed Castle Hill Reformed Church.





Market Walk

Market Walk, is set to undergo a vast transformation as renowned food hall and leisure developer, STACK, in collaboration with West Northamptonshire Council, will revitalise the prominent space, breathing new life into the heart of the town with the introduction of a new leisure and entertainment destination.

The project will ignite the town's vibrancy and vitality, supporting both the day time and night-time economy.

With an investment of £4.175 million from the Towns Fund and an additional £8 million from STACK, this project will create a vibrant social hub for the community. The redevelopment will include a diverse selection of independent street food traders, bars, interactive games, communal seating, and a main stage for live music performances, catering to all ages and interests.



Northampton Train Station Phase 2

A new multi-storey car park will provide improved facilities at Northampton Train Station, by increasing the number of spaces from 800 to 1,198. West Northamptonshire Council (WNC), Network Rail and its development partner, BlocWork are working in partnership to deliver the scheme which will offer increased capacity within the well-used train station for visitors, residents and commuters; as well as improved facility to improve customer experience. The development will enhance the gateway into the town, and bring forward the further potential for commercial and residential use
